

Public Comment Management & Analysis



Public comments are essential components of federal rule making. When a federal agency proposes a new regulation, it must provide the public with an opportunity to comment on it before it is finalized. Similarly, agencies often seek public comment via requests for information. As the public submits comments—many of which are technical—they must be collected, screened, categorized, coded, interpreted, and delivered back to the agency promptly. Comments vary in length and scope and the widespread use of form letters adds to the complexity of legal requirement that the agency respond to each comment. Analysts must understand the regulations, know the right keywords to search for, and grasp the context and relevance of comments to code them accurately. Agencies often partner with contractors to manage the volume and tight timelines for processing public comments.

Ripple Effect has developed a flexible solution that rapidly responds to the challenges of public comment management and analysis, while ensuring a high quality, consistent result. Ripple Effect employs an 80-person part-time analyst workforce, geographically dispersed and highly skilled in qualitative analysis, to support public comment coding efforts. When a commenting project arises, we rapidly deploy and thoroughly prepare a team to meet the size of the effort and the agency's needs. Our analysts are trained to identify proverbial 'needles in haystacks'—the valuable comments and contextual clues that can help guide revisions to a proposed federal rule or resolve requests for information.

Ripple Effect COmment aNalysis (RECON) supports each stage of the process. Our custom-designed, secure software solution is used to store, code, and summarize public comments.

Data Retrieval

 RECON can ingest FDMS bulk extracts and enables us to filter, triage, de-duplicate, cluster, search, code, and machine-classify a large volume of unstructured units of text

Coding

- Our duplicate and near-duplicate identification system was specifically developed for highvolume public comment rulemaking efforts using Natural Language Processing (NLP)
- RECON links parsed, coded comments to original submissions for ease of traceability
- Priority submissions receive dedicated attention to quickly surface key stakeholder recommendations
- RECON exports real-time comment logs and dashboards to inform customized dashboards for our clients
